Remembering the Past - Building the Future

19-21 March 2016, Thessaloniki, Greece

"Remembering the Past-Building the Future" is an eighteen-month international project within the framework of the "Europe for Citizens" programme which aims to show how memory, despite its fragility, manages to preserve the past against the destructive work of time and brings along the hope for a better future. The main objectives of this project are to review the images of European history through art and intercultural dialogue, to commemorate the victims of the Second World War and to lay emphasis on the present crisis regarding the identity and the diversity of the EU.

The project consists of 4 international events taking place in Thessaloniki (GR), Olesnica and Wroclaw (PL), Dresden (DE), Budapest and Kistarcsa (HU).

The first international event takes place in Thessaloniki on the occasion of the 73rd anniversary of the first deportations of Thessaloniki's Jews to Auschwitz-Birkenau death camp, from 19 to 21 March 2016, while it is also part of the celebration for the 90th anniversary of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. The event is organised by katArte Art & Technology Lab in cooperation with Jugend- & Kulturprojekt e.V., Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and the Young Entrepreneurs of Thessaloniki. The international event in Thessaloniki includes the following activities:

1) Conference: "Remembering the Past – Building the Future", 2) Exhibition: "Between Land & Sky", 3) Participation in the Commemoration March: "Thessaloniki-Auschwitz. Never again", 4) Exhibition: Vanishing Point, 5) Music Concert "A tutti Ioro...".
